
Meet Penny

Penny is a mouth painter. She paints pictures of nature.


Penny sells her paintings.



Penny visits schools and hospitals.




Penny uses a wheelchair.

with her chin.




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
How does Penny paint a picture?

down the paper.




3 Penny mixes the paint with water.

4 Usually, Penny paints from a photo.




Why does Penny paint with her mouth?
