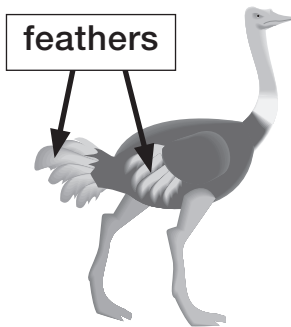



Family has an ostrich farm

- ✓ Ostriches can live 50 to 75 years.
- ✓ They can run up to 60 kilometres per hour.
- ✓ An ostrich hen lays about 60 eggs per year. The eggs hatch in 42 days.
