Here are the directions for the snow sculpture on page TN-5. Put the steps in order. What comes first? Next?




Pack down the snow with a shovel, your foot and your hands.




Remove snow from the corners.




Add some snow for the head.

Make four legs.




The turtle is done.

Make a line around the body. Remove some snow below the line.


