

VOLUNTEER TUTOR DESCRIPTION

Role

To assist an adult learner in improving reading, writing, math and/or assisting with improving English language skills.

Responsibilities

- Attend tutor orientation and tutor training workshops.
- Discuss with the adult learner a time and location that suits both people.
- Foster an environment that makes the learner feel comfortable and able to learn.
- Plan, prepare and give lessons that support the learners' goals, learning needs and interests.
- Communicate on a regular basis with the literacy coordinator.
- Report immediately to the coordinator regarding any problems that arise or if the tutoring is terminated.
- Participate in project evaluation.
- Keep records of the learner's progress, lesson times, tutor hours, preparation and travel time.

Time Commitment

- Training Time: attend orientation workshop and tutor training workshops
- **Tutoring Time**: The time commitment varies for each student-tutor pair and depends on the student's aspirations. Typically, tutoring time requires one to two hours per week plus time for lesson planning. A minimum commitment as a tutor is six months.

Support Provided

- Orientation and tutor training workshops.
- Learning resources collection in the Parkland Adult Literacy office.
- Consultation with the literacy coordinator (re: resources, methods, activities...)

Qualifications

- Proficiency in reading and writing skills.
- Empathy, patience and enthusiasm.
- Culturally sensitive and enjoy working with people from other countries.
- Willingness to commit to the tutor responsibilities.
- Minimum grade 12.
